The grade of F indicates that the student failed at the end of the semester or was doing failing work at the time of officially dropping the course after the twelfth week of the semester. CR-credit (passing grade for non-letter graded courses equivalent to B quality or better for graduate students. C quality or better for undergraduate students). NC-no credit (failing grade for non-letter-graded courses). P-pass (passing grade equivalent to C quality or better for letter-graded courses where a student elects to take it on a Pass/No Pass basis). NP-no pass (failing grade for courses taken on a Pass/No Pass basis).

The following marks are also used: W-withdrawn; UW-unofficial withdrawal; NR-no record or attendance; MG-missing grade (an administrative mark used in cases where an instructor fails to submit a final course grade for a student); IN-incomplete (work of passing quality through the twelfth week of the semester but not completed because of illness or other good reason). Undergraduates must remove incompletes in undergraduate level courses by the end of the semester following the one in which IN was assigned. Graduate students are allowed one year from the date of assignment of the mark of IN in graduate level courses. If not removed within the specified time limits, marks of IN automatically become grades of IX (expired incomplete) and the units calculate in the grade point average with zero grade points. IP-in progress (interim mark for course exceeding one semester).
